Mrs. Burnett is a graduate of the New York Institute of Photography and has completed numerous courses in fine arts and photography at a number of schools and institutes over the years, including the Saidye Bronfman Centre and Stewart Hall. Recently she completed a one week intensive course at the Santa Fe Photography Workshop in New Mexico.

The opportunity to travel to many parts of the globe including Kenya, Tanzania, South Africa, Italy, Panama, Mexico, the Caribbean and the United States has allowed her to build a broad portfolio of photographs on a variety of themes from all over the world. She equally enjoys taking photographs all over Montreal, particularly the older urban and industrial areas of the city.

She works mainly in the realm of digital photography. Her artistic photographs span a wide variety of subjects and styles. Lori Segall Burnett is the current president of TRAM (Table ronde sur l'art de Mont-Royal), an organization whose mission is to promote art and artistic life in the Town of Mount Royal.

The Reginald J. P. Dawson Library proudly provides an exhibition space to Mount Royal artists. Specifically, the space comprises an entire brick wall visible from throughout the main hall, which provides a wide range of viewing angles, and two display cases located in the foyer. The exhibition space is in keeping with the library's cultural mission and the temporary exhibits shown in it give local artists a way to become better known by the general public.

Artists who would like to exhibit their work at the library are encouraged to submit an application. It should be noted that the waiting period for an exhibit space is usually 24 months.
